Region IV thinks Centennial in seeking new grant

TWIN FALLS — In competition for a new federal grant program, the Region IV Development Association has decided to think Centennial.

A \$50,000 U.S. Forest Service grant could be made available to the region to help rural economic development projects, Region IV Executive Director Joe Herring told his board of directors Thursday.

"This is a grant for planning and implementing operational programs, not for doing studies," he said.

Board members will look for ways to raise matching funds for the project. "Matching funds are not required for this grant," Herring said, "but, in order to be competitive, we are going to need as much as possible — anything from office space to

labor to money."

The board discussed a number of ways to use the grant funds.

Mike Glenn suggested the region apply for the money by suggesting a multi-county tourism project in conjunction with Idaho's Centennial.

"This would be a regional project, with all of the counties involved," Glenn said. "Maybe we could use some of the money to publish booklets describing and promoting the eight counties in the region and place them at area tourist centers."

Herring said a tourism video might be possible.

Gavino Cavazos agreed, saying it could draw people stationed at Mountain Home Air Force Base.

Glenn liked the idea too, adding that a video would probably cost around \$1,000 a minute to produce.

Paul Matthews suggested the Region IV staff meet with representatives of area travel councils to get their comments.

Applications for the grant must be completed by Feb. 23, Herring said, and the decision could be made by mid-April.

The project must be started within 60 days after the grant has been awarded, he said, and the money must be spent within a year.

In other business:

Herring reported that the association will pick among three choices a consultant to help decide the feasibility of establishing a grain cleaning/milling facility in Idaho.

"There is no facility that mills flour for human consumption in the state of Idaho," he said.

The region recently received a \$15,000 grant from the Economic Development Association to study the matter. The idea is that the region could use the study as a tool

University staff wants place to mix

MOSCOW (AP) — University of Idaho faculty and staff need a place on campus where they can socialize, say two professors who will suggest creating a club for school employees to the UI Faculty Council.

Communications professor Roy Atwood and law professor Neil Franklin will ask the council on Tuesday to consider establishing a facility that would serve meals and drinks to university staff and friends. The club probably could support itself through sales and membership fees, they say.

"This is one of the few universities I've been to where there isn't a place where faculty from different departments can get together and socialize," Franklin said Thursday. "One of the nice things about working at a university is sharing ideas beyond disciplinary lines. But that's hard if there isn't a center where people can meet."

A faculty club is not a new idea at the UI.

Used 1970, a popular faculty club was located in what now is the Satellite Student Union Building, said Faculty Secretary Danne Lutz.

The club moved to Brink Hall, where the Faculty Council meets, when it ran into financial problems. Students were clamoring for a centrally located snack bar.

Corrections Department seeks more prison space

BOISE (AP) — Idaho Corrections officials have taken their campaign for still more prison space to the Legislature as state inmates began backing up in county jails again — less than three months after the new 250-bed maximum security prison opened.

"The big problem we have — and it will continue to be a problem — is with our prison population," said Corrections Board Chairman Wendell Miller of Idaho Falls told legislative budget writers on Thursday.

Corrections Director Richard Vernon outlined the governor's



plans to handle the persisting inmate population problem, pointed out to the Joint Finance-Appropriations Committee that after opening the new prison just fall 90 inmates were again being held in county facilities this week.

The administration plan calls for \$400,000 renovation of the old Fremont General Hospital in St. Anthony into a 160-inmate work

center and construction of a \$3.5-million, 200-inmate minimum or security cell unit at the main prison south of Boise. Each new facility would cost about \$1 million to operate.

Vernon, making his first budget presentation to the committee, said that in the past 3½ months, the state's prison population has risen at an average rate of 31 inmates a month. While he expects that pace to abate — in coming months — he indicated there will be a need for space to house another 300 inmates by early 1991.

He also made a pitch for a 150-

million women's prison to house 160 inmates in the Boise area. But at the same time, he emphasized the need to find other criminal justice options to housing lawbreakers in county state prisons.

"We can't keep building \$30 million prisons," he said. "We need to come up with alternative programs that are safe and more effective than putting these people in an \$80,000 cell."

Work camps like the one

scheduled in St. Anthony and expansion of the so-called 130-day program, where probation is available to low-risk felons successfully undergoing minimum-security treatment and counseling, are the best prospects now, Vernon indicated.

He even said he had not given up on the possibility of converting an abandoned federal work camp near Prichard in northern Idaho into a work camp.

never been paid equally with five years.

Wood makes \$38,600 and Baxter makes \$41,400, Freley said.

Wood said John Schilling, an attorney in the prosecutor's office who passed the state bar less than a year ago, earns more than his chief deputy, Lisa Barini Garcia, with several years' experience.

"I guess I could put up a stink about it," Wood said. "I don't intend to."

Freley said he could not comment on the state law because he has not heard of it.

It is possible Wood could be rehired, he said. At any rate, the commission will make a decision within the next few weeks, he said.

"I want to make the decision early enough to be fair to Mike," he said. "I don't want to put anyone out at the last second."

Meanwhile, Wood said he has been looking for a new job.

"No one has spoken with me saying that they were still considering me," he said.
